Consider...

Use the summary and discussion below to review and apply this week's message:

Message Summary

Most things – given enough time – settle. Houses, dust, people. But we serve a King whose kingdom is always growing, expanding and never settling, and our King doesn't want settlers. In Numbers 9:15-23, we find His recipe for keeping us from settling, and He did it be moving His people. Moving keeps us from settling!

- 1. **We move when He moves:** This is all about "whenever" and it definitely challenges our comfort because often we could find ourselves just getting comfortable and then we're on the go again.
- 2. **We stop when He stops:** This is all about "wherever" and it challenges our trust. All of the why's get asked here, don't they? "Why here? Why now? Why aren't we moving?"
- 3. **We want to be with Him:** If we're moving and stopping for any other reason than our love for Jesus, we won't last during the moves. Moving wasn't a duty as much as an opportunity, and this challenges our motives. If the motive is love for Jesus, we'll obey and find joy in it (see John 14:15).
- 4. **His presence becomes our preference:** You've heard us say lately that we want to value God's presence over our preferences as a church, but what we ultimately want is for His presence to <u>become</u> our preference. This challenges our passion do we truly want Jesus and His presence in our lives more than anything else? If we do, moving is a small inconvenience to be with Him where He is going!

Discuss

Use the following questions to review and apply the points learned in the message.

- What takeaway if any did you have from the message this week?
- Why is it so easy to settle? In what ways have you settled?
- Read Philippians 4:12 and talk about the difference between settling and contentment. How did saying he was content in "all circumstances" hint at Paul's life full of movement?
- How does God lead His people today? More than likely none of us have a cloud or fire over our houses and cars! But what do we have to guide us as we follow Jesus? (see John 16:13)
- Galatians 5:25 is how we "watch the cloud" today. How can we keep in step with the Spirit?
- Finally, describe what a life would look like when God's presence is our preference. From 1-10, where would you fall on that scale?
